INDIANAPOLIS, Ind., March 15.—Don M. Roberts, mayor of Terre Haute is involved in the trial here with fifty others, for alleged election frauds. The trial is likely to be the most sensational election fraud case in years. Roberts and other politicians are accused of wholesale election frauds—in fact, with stealing an election in the most bold faced manner. They have pleaded not guilty. Federal Judge Anderson is hearing the case. VICTOR MURDOCK NEW NATIONAL CHAIRMAN OF THE BULL MOOSERS. WASHINGTON, March 11.—Representative Victor Murdock of Kansas by a referendum to the national committee of the Progressive party has been elected to succeed Senator Joseph M. Dixon of Missouri, Mont., as chairman of the national committee. Mr. Murdock, the Bull Moose leader in the house, is one of the irreconcilables who oppose a merger with the Republican party in a dual nomination for president next year. Senator Dixon announced some time ago that he wished to retire as head of the national committee.
