INVESTIGATE CHARGES AGAINST LANGLEY
CINCINNATI, May 28.—It is believed that the probe to be made by the U. S. civil service commission into the charges that Congressman J. W. Langley, of Kentucky, who is at present a candidate for the nomination of the senate from that state, solicited campaign contributions from the National Association of Storekeepers, Guaguers and Storekeeper-Guaguers, in 1910 and 1911, and individual members of the association in this and other internal revenue districts, will be begun today or Monday.

LONDON, May 29.—Members of all political parties here are agreed on one thing, and that is that the formation of a coalition ministry means a complete breaking up of the present British party alignment. Some persons think it means the establishment of a new national party. All concur in the belief that the men now becoming united for war purposes must become so mutually involved in all kinds of projects that a complete separation in the future will be absolutely impossible. In the accompanying illustration are shown Arthur James Balfour, the outstanding figure in the Unionist party, who will lead the Unionist group in the new coalition ministry now being formed, and Winston Churchill, first lord of the admiralty, soon to retire.

WASHINGTON, May 31.—Dr. Alberto Membrano, Honduran minister to the United States, will leave for home this month, having been selected to be provisional president of Honduras for six months. Dr. Francisco Bertrand, who succeeded to the presidency of Honduras on the death of Bonilla, resigned recently in order so he could legally become a candidate for re-election. There is a constitutional provision in that republic that a president shall not be eligible as a candidate for the office within six months of the expiration of his term. Membrano was one of the aides of Bonilla when he laid the plans for the revolution which he successfully led against Davila's government in Honduras.
