

With scores of skilled workmen leav ing the Frankford arsenal at Philadelphia to accept places with private firms engaged in making European war munitions, there has arisen a situation so


serious that the federal authorities found that not only workmen, but foremen and officers, too, have been won away from the government shops by higher wages.

the machine shop quit just before his arrival. Recently twenty-five dropped their tools in the fuse department. The men declared they were signing three year contracts at \$5 a day.


