

OREGON BUILDING AT EXPOSITION POPULAR

BETWEEN 5000 AND 6000 VISIT EXHIBIT DAILY - LOGAN-BERRY JUICE SAMPLED

OREGON BUILDING, Panama Pacific Exposition, July 12.—The normal attendance at the Oregon building ranges around 5,000 to 6,000 a day, or about the same as the average daily attendance at the San Diego exposition.

Shriners, great crowds of them, have visited the Oregon building this week. Dr. Dunsmore, booster from Polk, headed one delegation that saw Oregon's glories here, and H. O. Preback, director of the southern Oregon booth, piloted groups through the building on Thursday.
