

STREET MASHERS ARE ASSAILED AT PURITY CONGRESS

WOMEN GATHERED AT CONVENTION DEMAND THEY BE PROTECTED

LOS ANGELES TAKES CREDIT FOR EXPELLING UNDESIRABLES

Chicago Woman Declares Industries Which do Not Support Their Employees Throughout Year Parasitic in Nature.

SAN FRANCISCO, July 19.—Street masher were blamed for much immorality by Miss Mary Brown, of Seattle, superintendent of the department of curfew, National Women's Christian Temperance Union, speaking before the International Purity Congress in session here.

"Women can walk down the street of the smallest village without running the gauntlet of insulting glances by men," Miss Brown said.

"God help us! Some of the men are in the very portals of our churches."

"You can't expect to protect a lamb or a group of lambs with the wolves rushing down upon them. The need of active protection if proclaimed by almost half a million openly immoral girls and women of this country, there probably is a far greater number of clandestinely immoral women. Numbers of schoolgirls are included in this company."

"We find this vast army of women ranges in age from 15 to 60 years! In mentality from those almost imbecile to the intellectually brilliant; and in morals from the coarse and vile blasphemer to the faithful attendant upon religious services, with personal habits of devotion."

"These immoral women represent every class and condition of life. No class is safe from ruin. If the vast army of women should go out of existence, scarce a month would pass before it would be replaced by recruits."

Speaking before the congress at the afternoon session, Miss M. L. Carpenter, who is affiliated with the University of Chicago's settlement work, declared that the masses of unemployed in America consist of two types—the unemployed themselves and the unemployed.

Miss Carpenter took for the subject of her address the "Function of the Church for Clean City Government" and said that the best social workers were to be found outside the church. She also said that the industries that were unable to support their employees throughout the year were parasitic.

GRANGE MAY ASK FOR AGRICULTURAL AGENT

RESOLUTION IS PREPARED AND WILL BE VOTED ON AT NEXT POMONA MEETING.

The employment of an agricultural agent for Clackamas county may be recommended by the Pomona grange, following a meeting of that body at Sandy Wednesday. The session was well attended and a good program was given.

A resolution, urging the employment of an expert by the county, was introduced but final action delayed until the next meeting of the grange at Harding, three months from now. The resolution was freely discussed at the meeting Wednesday and the grange will endeavor to bring the issue before the people in the next three months. The resolution follows in full:

Whereas, the national government has provided funds for the purpose of carrying the benefits of the scientific investigations of the experimental stations connected with the agricultural colleges direct to the farmers through the extension department and by means of a county agent;

Whereas, the state of Oregon has complied with the requirements of the national government by appropriating a like sum to assist in payment of the expenses of such agent in such counties as desire this agricultural expert;

Whereas, the state law required that each county employing the expert shall pay half his expenses and salary, the state and national government paying the other half; therefore be it

RESOLVED, that Clackamas County Pomona grange favors the appointment of an agricultural agent for this county, and resolved that necessary provision should be made for this agent in the formation of the next budget by the county court; and further

Resolved, that copies of these resolutions be forwarded to the county court and be furnished the papers of the county for publication and discussion.

A resolution urging Oregon representatives in congress to do all in their power to secure action of congress conferring title to the state of the Oregon & California railroad lands on payment of \$2.50 per acre, was passed.
