VALLEY HOGS GO UP 25 CENTS AT YARDS MARKET FOR CATTLE IN PORTLAND ADVANCES—NO MUT. TON ARRIVES. UNION STOCK YARDS, Portland, Feb. 7.—Willamette valley hogs are finding guaranteed quotations of \$7.75 in the local market a sheer advance of 25c over last week's prices. There was only one load of swine in the hog alleys at North Portland for the day. No shipments came forward from the interior, therefore the extreme quality stuff was not given a test. General hog market range: Choice light weights \$ 7.75 Good light weights 7.65 Medium weights 7.50 Rough and heavy 7.00-7.25 Two loads of cattle found their way into the North Portland yards over Sunday; one of them being from Idaho. Market for cattle is intensely firm with Willamette valley inferior quality sold at 25c over what the same sort of stuff brought last week. Top quality was not given a test during the morning but the sales of the poor stuff at the advance indicated a much firmer tone. No supplies at all reached the muton yards at North Portland over Sunday. Trend of the trade is naturally very strong but as nothing was available for sale, prices were not given any sort of test. However, the general outlook is for stronger prices. Before noon Monday eggs were selling on Front street Portland at 37 1/2 cents a dozen for candled and at 35 cents for case count. Dealers stated that at 35 cents they would be unable to clean up. A 35-cent case count price seems to be the ruling quotation.
