ORCHARDS DAMAGED BY STORM
OREGON AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE, Corvallis, Feb. 24.—(Special)—That the recent severe weather conditions have seriously affected Oregon orchards of peach, pear and cherry trees is evidenced by the large number of inquiries received by the department of horticulture of the Oregon Agricultural college within the past week. One orchardist writes of severe injuries to a 500-acre orchard of 5-year-old trees, and sent specimens of the injured trees to the station specialists.
Professor Lewis declared before leaving Corvallis that the unusually deep snow of the past month caused rabbits to attack not only young fruit trees, but also trees 5 or 6 years old.

RUN IS HEAVY BUT MARKET DEPRESSED

Prices on Cattle and Hogs Dropping
GOOD QUALITY OFFERED, BUT PRICES ARE LOW—SHEEP TRADE IS STRONG.
UNION STOCK YARDS, Portland, Feb. 21.—Something hit the livestock market at the Portland Union Stock Yards this morning. What it was, nobody seems to know, but before noon prices had dropped on cattle and hogs and advanced a nickel on lambs. The slow redeeming features of the market was the strength shown in the sheep house. Last Monday lambs brought \$9 and today \$9.95 for a fine bunch sent in by the Oregon Experiment Station at Union Junction.
What got into buyers and packers this morning is hard to say. Whatever it was, they were far from active, and despite the fact some of the stock offered was of strictly fancy quality, they didn't buy. It was not the fault of the shippers, but of the buyers themselves. All the week the cry has been sent up for "better quality." This was forthcoming today, but not a move was made to purchase. For a slow, dragging market, absolute devoid of interest and spirit, to beef scraps, Darling's, 100 lbs. 3.75; Bone, granulated, 100 lbs. 2.55; Bone meal, 100 lbs. 2.55.
The best price paid for pulp-fed steers, was \$7.50, a drop of 25 cents from last week. Some of the offerings were as good as seen in the market this season, but they were sacrificed. Such tactics will not make for improved conditions here nor build the market up to the standard hoped for. Every time a nail is driven into it, Seattle laughs and benefits.
For hogs, \$8.95 was again paid. This is a drop of 10 cents from the market close of Saturday, and shows the weakness.
