A trained nurse was called in to have charge of the patient. Monday another doctor was called into consultation.

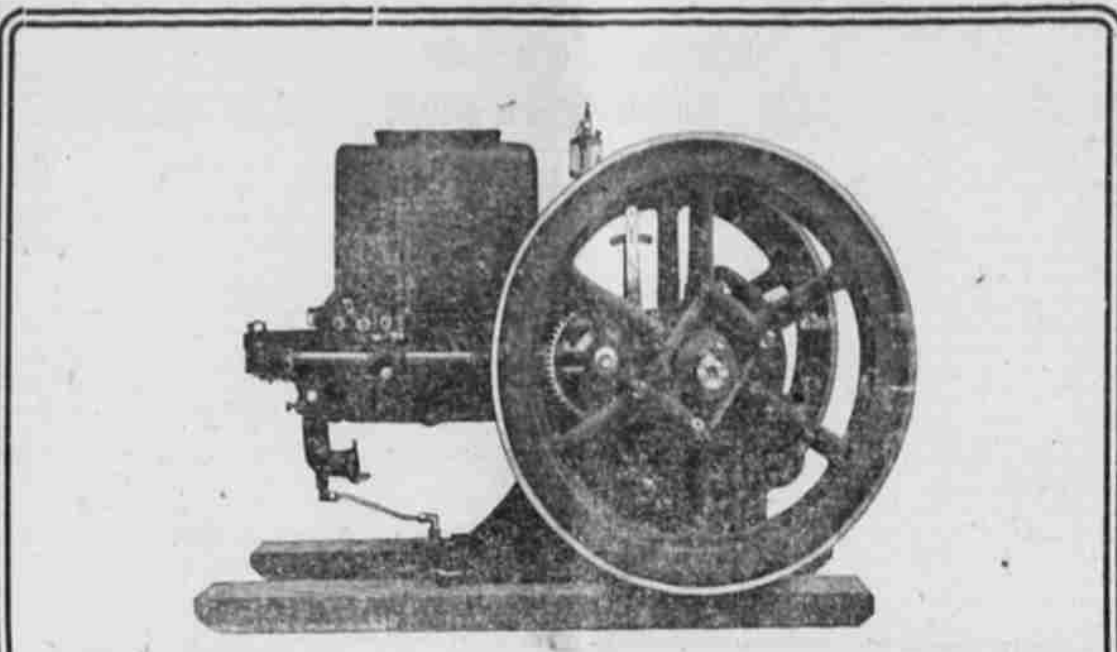
The doctors give out little hope of his recovery. The rheumatism has af-
