LIVESTOCK TRADE IS STEADY, UNCHANGED

SHEEPS SELL READILY BUT CATTLE GO SINGLY—HOGS HOLD UP.

UNION STOCK YARDS, Portland, Ore., April 27.—Today's livestock market at the Portland Union Stock Yards contained steady and unchanged. The run was not very large, the bulk of the early sales being in single in the cattle division. Sheep sold readily and at ruling quotations. It looked for a time as though the hog market might be lower as \$9 was the top paid during the first few hours, but yard officials reported the market unchanged, saying quality hogs would easily bring the top of \$9.10.

BULK OF HOG SALES BRING MORE THAN \$9

MARKET ADVANCES TO \$9.20 FOR TOPS—DEMAND AT YARDS IS EXCELLENT.

UNION STOCK YARDS, Portland, Ore., May 1.—While the hog market advanced this morning at the Portland Union Stock Yards to \$9.20 for the top quotation, the bulk of the sales of best hogs was made at prices ranging from \$9 to \$9.15. The market was in splendid shape and a large volume of sales were made during the early forenoon. The demand was excellent and buyers did not hesitate to pay top prices for quality offerings. Cattle were again strong with \$9 the top and sheep held at former prices.

MOVEMENT OF STOCK IS FEATURE OF DAY

MUTTON SOLD IN LARGE QUANTITIES AND GOOD PRICES ARE SECURED IN PORTLAND.

UNION STOCK YARDS, Portland, Ore., April 28.—The feature of the early livestock market at the Portland Union Stock Yards this morning was the movement of lambs, ewes and yearlings. Top prices were paid in most instances. The demand for cattle and hogs was as nothing in comparison to the mutton sales, and these were not heavy, only 167 head being on hand for sale. They were quickly cleaned up, however, and then buyers either quit entirely or turned their attention to other lines.

241,137 VOTERS IN OREGON REGISTERED

INCREASE OF 11,500 OVER 1914 AND GAIN OF REPUBLICANS ARE FEATURES.

SALEM, Ore., April 29.—Complete registration figures for Oregon, with the exception of Curry county, as indicated by the reports filed in the office of Secretary of State Olcott today, show 241,137 voters listed for the primary election of May 19. This is a gain of 5.92 per cent throughout the state over the registration before the primaries two years ago, when the total was 229,601.
