

UNEXPECTED HOLD UP AT LUNCHEON IS BIG SURPRISE

MASKED BANDITS WITH REVOLVERS RAISE FUNDS FOR ROSE QUEEN CAMPAIGN.

VISITORS ARE TAKEN THROUGH MILLS AND ABOUT THE CITY

S. L. Parrett, of Newberg, is Elected Chairman of Group One—Hector MacPherson Urges Adoption of Rural Credits.

Fifty staid and conservative bankers of group No. 1 of the Oregon State Bankers association, gathered for luncheon at the Commercial club, were held up and robbed at noon Saturday by two masked highwaymen and little Miss Winifred Ball, the six-year-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Clifford Ball. The \$20 raised by the holding will be used in the campaign of Miss Rose Uptegrove, Clackamas county candidate for queen of the Portland Rose festival.

The affair was totally unexpected. Even Leroy Walker, chairman of the group, did not know of the plan. H. Leighton Kelly and Ralph Sheppard, each wearing a large black mask and each with two large dangerous-looking revolvers, walked into the room and commanded the bankers to throw up their hands.

There was a nervous shifting at the tables. Every banker threw up his hands. The tables were cleared and Little Miss Ball, carrying an arm full of roses and pink carnations, a small revolver and a basket walked down the table, holding up each individual member of the group.

Well-Known Men Talk.

The program of the third semi-annual convention of the group included several of the most prominent men of this section of the state, and the bankers declared that the meeting was the most successful in the history of the organization. The convention ran an hour over the schedule time, and even then the bankers spent 20 minutes asking questions of the various speakers.

The convention was called to order at 10:30 o'clock Saturday morning by Leroy Walker, president of the Bank of Commerce of this city and chairman of the group. Rev. J. K. Hawkins, of the Methodist church, delivered the invocation and O. D. Eby, president of the Commercial club, welcomed the visiting bankers. A. C. Shute, president of the American National bank of Hillsboro, responded.

Dean W. Morton, of the school of commerce of the University of Oregon, spoke on "Accounting and Banking Methods," describing the latest and best methods of bank accounting.

Luncheon is Served.

Oregon City bankers served luncheon at noon for the visiting bankers, and at the close of the luncheon Mrs. Eva Emery Dye, author of "McLaughlin and Old Oregon, 'The Conquest,'" and other books, told of Oregon City's connection with pioneer Oregon.

Hector MacPherson, of the extension department of the Oregon Agricultural college, spoke, advocating a system of state rural credits. His talk was one of the features of the session. T. H. West, vice-president of the American Institute of Banking and Transit, and manager of the Ladd & Tilton bank of Portland, describing the national thrift campaign.

C. L. Smith, agriculturist of the Oregon-Washington Railroad & Navigation company, declared that one of the greatest needs of western Oregon was diversified farming. A. P. Bateham of the Portland Chamber of Commerce urged greater co-operation between the bankers and the fruit growers.

Visitors Shown Through Mills.

At the close of the session in the Commercial club, the visiting bankers were taken to the Crown Willamette mill and shown through the plant. Alford Naterlin and Sam Nitch, with two larger power boats, took the party up the river to the falls and landed them on the east side of the river. They then went through the Hawley Pulp & Paper company mills. The trip through the Oregon City woollen mills was cancelled on account of lack of time.
