

THREE DIVORCE SUITS ARE FILED IN A DAY

HUSBAND CHARGES DESERTION, TWO WIVES CRUELTY—DISMISSAL IS SIGNED.

Not a marriage license has been issued in Clackamas county this month, and divorce cases are filed with the usual regularity. Three suits were filed Saturday in which cruelty and desertion are the basis of the action. W. B. Dillard filed a suit against Edith Galloway Dillard, alleging desertion. They were married in Lane county, September 9, 1907. Hammond & Hammond for the defendant immediately filed a demurrer to the complaint, alleging facts insufficient to constitute a cause of action. The attorneys for the plaintiff forgot to sign the complaint. Margaret E. Williams charges cruelty against Clarence H. Williams. They were married January 1, 1911, in Portland. She asks for \$150 suit money. Edie M. Rutherford alleges in her divorce complaint that her husband, David W. Rutherford, hit her. They were married in this county March 30, 1911. She asks for the return of her maiden name, Elsie Critcher. Circuit Judge Campbell Saturday signed an order dismissing the suit of Florence White against the Portland Gas & Coke company for personal injuries received when an automobile ran into one of the company's trenches and overturned.
