EDWARD JOHNSTON IN CIVIL WAR 4 YEARS

MAN WHO SERVED THROUGH CONFLICT'S GREATEST BATTLES IS LAID TO REST.

With the passing away of Edward Johnston, who met his death by being crushed by a railway train at Payal, Wash., Wednesday, and whose remains were brought here for interment in the Catholic cemetery yesterday, one more of the old guard who stood by the flag from 1861 to 1865, "the days that tried men's souls," is mottored out.

In 1861, then in his 19th year, Mr. Johnston enlisted as a private in the 88th New York Volunteer infantry regiment and participated with his regiment in all the battles of peninsular campaign in eastern Virginia.
