

Sheriff and Lawyer Help Woman Get Trunk From Sister

Frieda E. Palmgren, aged 26 years, fainted on Main street opposite the county courthouse Saturday afternoon, after a trip with Sheriff Wilson to the home of her sister, Mrs. Marie Notturft, to regain possession of her clothing and a trunk. Dr. Frank Mount was called. He attributed the fainting to over excitement.

Mrs. Palmgren came to Clackamas county to visit her sister, Saturday the latter forced Mrs. Palmgren out of her house, even refusing to allow her to take her clothing or trunk. Sheriff Wilson and Mrs. Palmgren went to the Notturft home a mile above Willamette, but met with such

a warm reception from Mrs. Notturft they came back to Oregon City.

John N. Stevers, attorney, drew up papers in a replevin suit which was filed in the circuit court, donating his service. She did not have money to pay filing fees and District Attorney Hodges, Sheriff Wilson, Chief Deputy Hackett and others about the courthouse raised the necessary money.

Armed with legal papers, Sheriff Wilson, Attorney Stevers and Mrs. Palmgren made a second trip to the Notturft home and secured the clothing without difficulty.

Mrs. Notturft Explains.

WEST LINN, Ore., July 18.—(Editor of The Enterprise)—As there appeared in the Morning Enterprise of July 18, an article concerning Mrs. Marie Notturft, near Willamette, of forcing her sister out of her house, I would like to give my friends my side of the story, through the same paper, to show them that Mrs. Palmgren left my house willingly and not by force as was first mentioned in Sunday's paper.

Upon receiving this letter I sent my sister \$5 by return mail and asked her in a letter to let me know if her husband had left her. Next answer was a telegram from Cincinnati, Ohio, which read: "I'm needed for tickets and expenses—wire money C. A. Palmgren."

Then I borrowed the money and telegraphed it to her. The next day came telegram number 2. "I am sick and have nothing telegraph money this office, at once, Friede."

Then I telegraphed back the tickets were there. Whereupon I received telegram No. 3, which said, "Southern Pacific round about trip, dangerous, war time. Telegraph money, trust me to buy tickets here. Rush, Friede."

These telegrams were all charged to Mrs. Notturft. Then came another call for \$25 more, which I was unable to send, but had to stop her from sending unpaid telegrams. Whereupon I received another telegram that Mrs. Palmgren had left Cincinnati for Oregon. Then came letter number 2, which is as follows:

"Cincinnati, Ohio, June 20, 1916.—Dearest Marie and family: Dear God, Marie, I received your two letters without money yesterday, and today your money order for \$5. Hope I will get the tickets sooner here. For it is going crooked with me here. You see now I am here in Cincinnati, Ohio, a young Spanish man took me and my boy here. I met him in Galveston, Texas, where I was happy, but I had to fall in love with him. It cost only 75 cents on the boat. This was cheaper than that way, than to pay debts in Louisville, Ky., as I would have been thrown out in the street, had I lingered there. Oh, it took two weeks to hear from you, had it not been for that Spaniard I would have been had off. Now I am here and he does not come near me, so I am terrible bad in it. I hope to God you have sent the money by telegraph, so we can come, then I will leave this coming Saturday. He will not send any more telegraph at it once for my dear sister, it takes too long per post and one has trouble getting it at the postoffice and I must live. The longer I'm here the more I owe and this lady holds my trunk until I pay. So one hundred dollars is necessary to get my trunk, something to eat and pay lodging. In these two weeks I have suffered terrible. Yes, I hear from my sister and when I got the letter, the lady stood there and looked at me cross, then she got \$4 and I got \$1. Till that money comes and saves me, I should not have given me my death. Yes, Mr. Palmgren was good, heavenly good, but a good friend had brought him into this bad luck and the only way we can be happy is that I must come to you. Mr. Palmgren will come to his senses, take his business in New Orleans again and then come to Oregon. He is without money, but can bring himself through. Lodging costs lots and worth doing without money. Marie, were it not every cent I should have never trou-
