The thermometer registers about 84 degrees. Fruits grow close to where they are camped, and oranges, large juicy ones, can be purchased at one cent each, while grape fruit is given to the boys.

Another letter comes to friends from one of the soldiers telling of the distribution of the rations, that "looked good" to the boys, as lying on the hard ground was anything but soothing. He also says that the water is much better than where they were first camped, but they all longed for a drink of good Oregon City water. This soldier is not impressed with Palm City, and terms it "a wide place in the road."

P. ZIMMERMAN DIDN'T WRITE SUICIDE NOTE STEPHON OF MISSING MAN EXAMINES MESSAGE FOUND IN BOTTLE.
