PAT HARRIS' ONLY SON ATTACKS PORTLAND MAN NAMED ADMINISTRATOR

PATRICK L. HARRIS SAYS HE DID NOT AUTHORIZE LAWYERS TO REPRESENT HIM.

Charges of misrepresentation in a petition for the appointment of an administrator in the Patrick Harris estate, filed by Virgil L. Clark and Elmon A. Geneste, Portland attorneys, are contained in a petition filed Monday in the probate department of the county court by Harvey E. Cross, local attorney, representing Patrick L. Harris, only son of the late Patrick Harris. Patrick Harris, a resident of Gladstone, died at his home July 17, 1915. At the time of his death the location of his son was not known. A month later Virgil Clark, representing Elmon A. Geneste, as an attorney, filed a petition for the appointment of an administrator for the estate, claiming that he held letters and a telegram from Patrick L. Harris, sent from San Antonio, asking that the estate be probated. Geneste and Clark are partners. Geneste was named administrator by County Judge Anderson and the estate was appraised. Excluding the value of property in Gladstone, the estate was appraised at \$10, while it is said, Mr. Harris left \$3000 on deposit in a local bank and held several notes. Soon after the appointment of Geneste by the court, H. H. Hughes, a creditor, represented by John N. Sievers, filed a petition asking that he be appointed administrator, claiming that Geneste did not represent either a creditor or a relative. Geneste settled Hughes' claim and the Hughes petition will be withdrawn. In the petition filed Monday Mr. Harris, Jr., says that he does not know either Clark or Geneste, that he has never been in San Antonio, Texas, and that he never communicated, either by wire or letter, with the Portland lawyers who claim to hold correspondence from him. Mr. Harris further declares that he has not been outside of the state of Oregon for some time, and that he is a resident of Beaverton, Washington county, this state, and has lived there for some time past. He did not know of his father's death until last Saturday, almost two months after the Gladstone man died.
