PORTLAND, Ore., Oct. 21.—Nebraska's unbeaten football machine invaded Oregon today and emerged victorious with the scalp of the Oregon Agricultural college dangling in the breezes.

The Cornhuskers' victory was decisive as to score—17 to 7—yet, the 7500 fans scattered to their homes singing praises for the fighting freshmen coached by Joseph Pipal.

The hero yesterday was "Tuffy" Cogg, the doughty 150-pound Pasadena lad, who is playing half for the Oregon Aggies.

Cogg recovered a fumble in mid-air a yard or two back of his own goal line, so his dash to touchdown was something like 101 or 102 yards. A moment later Cogg kicked goal and tied the score in a bow knot, 7 to 7.
