

T. R. Wins Cheers By Jibing Wilson

Colonel Theodore Roosevelt is having a busy and a happy time. He is on the campaign for Charles Evans Hughes, going all his old-time vigor. Everywhere he is met by big crowds and everywhere he is arousing enthusiasm for the Republican nominees.

The correspondent of the New York Tribune on Colonel Roosevelt's special has the following to say about the tour of Missouri and Kansas:

Whenever a man in the crowd shouts "Hurrah for Wilson" and usually at least one of the president's admirers is found in each town—the Colonel turns to face him squarely. He tightens his lips until the Roosevelt teeth gleam savagely, his voice becomes a snarl and his face flushes.

"That's right; cheer for Woodrow," the Colonel cries. "Then, with the spirit of cowardice in your heart, cheer also for the murderer of the babies on the Lusitania! Cheer for the murdered men and women in Mexico! Cheer for Boyd and Adair, murdered in the presence of their troops at Carrizal. That's the cheer for a man who is 'too proud to fight!'"

If the Wilson rooster keeps shouting, his cries are drowned by the crowd, invariably sympathetic to the Colonel.

He always gets cheers when he leans from the rear platform and says with a Roosevelt smile: "The foreign governments knew that I was not 'too proud to fight.' They knew that when I said a thing that I would back it up by deeds."

In his longer speeches Mr. Roosevelt appeals for the election of a Republican senate and house to support Mr. Hughes in grappling with the problems after the European war.

Intensely pleased with his reception at Louisville, Colonel Roosevelt was in a cheerful mood the next morning. He left his coffee to greet a crowd at Washington, Mo., a small German settlement.

As he raised his clenched fist preparatory to delivering the customary "too proud to fight" talk, the Colonel was interrupted by a full-throated salutation in German.

"Wilkommen, herrliche wilkommen, Herr Teddy," said Robert L. Boergell.

"Es freut mich sehr Ihnen zu begegnen, mein herr," responded the Colonel. They continued their conversation in German and then Mr. Roosevelt translated for the benefit of the crowd.

"My friend here asks me to not forget that the Germans have done for America. I told him that I knew the Germans had saved Missouri for the Union. He tells me that he is an American first, or, as he puts it, an ardent American. I tell him that both he and I are Americans; not German-Americans or British-Americans or Dutch-Americans, but plain Americans.

"My friend represents the great body of loyal Germans in this country."

Here Julius Rumbach, corpulent and in overall, the lad of his little bakery business, thrust a doughy hand up to the Colonel.

"In gut Bull Mooser," said Julius. "I got one de biggest families in dis town."

"How many have you got, my friend?" asked Mr. Roosevelt.

"Only seven," answered the baker.

"Good! You've beaten me by one," the Colonel cried as he wrung Julius's hand.

"But I beat you, Teddy! I beat you," repeated Rumbach, laughing.

Germany Is Near Break With Norway

AMSTERDAM, Oct. 24.—Serious crisis has arisen between Germany and Norway, the climax of which, it is feared in well informed quarters in Norway and Germany, may result in a diplomatic break.

It is understood here that continuation of friendly relations between the two nations depends in large measure on Norway's answer to Berlin's note demanding recession from the Norwegian stand regarding treatment of German submarines in open Norwegian waters. The original Norwegian note was resented by Germany as distinctly "unfriendly."

At the same time there are symptoms which Sweden is experiencing a change of heart toward the allies, symptoms which in pro-ally circles are interpreted as foreshadowing a probable alliance.

Should Norway enter the war, Sweden and Denmark, too, would, through an agreement existing between the three Scandinavian countries, stand with that nation. Significant in this connection is regarded the release by Russia at this time of a large number of Swedish vessels detained since the war, as reported this morning from Paris. The Scandinavian agreement first reached at a conference at Malmo, was again strengthened a few days ago at a meeting of the prime ministers of the three countries in Christiania. This conference concerned not only conditions during the war but also such as may arise after its conclusion.
