

CITY MAY FIGHT COUNTY PLAN TO CUT ROAD LEVY

STEPS TO SAFEGUARD CITY IN FINANCIAL WAY TO BE PUT TO TAXPAYERS.

AUTO FIRE TRUCK APPROPRIATION FIRST PLACE TO CUT, SAYS MAYOR

Drastic Slicing of Estimates for 1917 Necessary if County Abides by Plan to Change Millage—Councilmen Individually Liable

Threatened by a serious reduction in the city's income for 1917, due to the action of the county court in reducing the road levy from 8 to 6 mills, Mayor Hackett and members of the council are considering plans whereby the budget can be brought within the income. The city received 70 per cent of the general county road tax collected on city property and a reduction in the millage would cut the income materially.

The county road levy has been 8 mills for several years, but the county court now proposes to fix the general levy at 6 mills and make a special levy of 2 mills to repair and construct bridges and buy road materials. Other counties in Oregon are said to have used this plan successfully.

There is a possibility that the city may take legal steps in an effort to prevent the county court from adopting this proposal. Such action, however, city authorities said yesterday, rests largely with the taxpayers at the budget meeting November 20, when the budget will be checked over.

Taken, there is a possibility that at the county taxpayers' meeting in December, the proposal favored by the county court may be voted down and the plan of making a straight 8 mill road levy followed.

Mayor Hackett said yesterday that the first thing to be cut out of the budget would be an appropriation for the purchase of an automobile fire truck. Still other changes, however, in the cut-out budget would probably be necessary.

The city makes a 7-mill levy for the general operating expenses of the city and 7 mills to take up city bonds and meet interest payments. Under an amendment to the city charter adopted a year ago, the council is compelled to draft and submit to the voters a fully itemized budget. If this budget is exceeded more than 10 per cent, the members of the council are held individually, financially liable for the excess expenditure. For this reason, the city fathers exercise great care in drafting the estimates and material reductions are probable.
