WEST MEETS THE EAST AND TAKES ALL THE HONORS

GLADSTONE CONSIDERS CONNECTION WITH THE SOUTH FORK PIPELINE

FORWARD PASSES AND PUNTS ARE FEATURE OF POST-SEASON PASADENA GAME

PASADENA, Cal., Jan. 1.—The west met the east here this afternoon and the west triumphed when the University of Oregon clashed with the University of Pennsylvania and won, 14 to 0.

The victory of the Oregonians was a surprise here, as betting odds favored Pennsylvania to win by from 10 points to touchdowns.

The day was ideal for football, and thousands of fans witnessed the game, many coming here from the east.

COUNCIL APPOINTS COMMITTEE TO TAKE MATTER UP WITH OREGON CITY, WEST LINN

The Gladstone city council at the first meeting of the new year Tuesday night discussed ways and means whereby the town water system could be connected with the South Fork pipeline, and a committee, composed of Councilmen Vedder, Hempstead and Barlow and Mayor Howell, was appointed to take the matter up with the proper authorities in West Linn and Oregon City.

The pipeline has a capacity of about 4,000,000 gallons a day, and West Linn and Oregon City, the towns owning the line, use less than a million gallons daily.

Gladstone now is supplied with water by a well on the banks of the Clackamas river. The pump is said to be inadequate to supply the demand of the growing town, and the city must either look elsewhere for its water or install new pumps.

The Gladstone council organized Tuesday night for the coming year, H. E. Cross was elected president, Henry Wegner, street superintendent, and Thomas Gault, water superintendent.

CERBONI USES A SUSPENDER STRAP TO HANG HIMSELF

ITALIAN, HELD FOR KILLING FELLOW COUNTRYMAN, SEEKS DEATH TO END TROUBLES

BELOVED MANDOLIN CAN'T BE FOUND, PROBABLY IS BURNED

Sheriff Wilson and Dr. Hempstead Work for 45 Minutes Over Body In Unsuccessful Effort To Restore Life.

Toni Cerboni, awaiting action by the grand jury on a charge of second degree murder, brought his troubles to an end Thursday by hanging himself with a suspender strap in the county jail.

The Italian selected the same part of the jail in which Charlie Wilson, charged with killing Mamie Walsh, hanged himself in 1893.

Beloved Mandolin Disappears. Gone with Cerboni is his beloved mandolin. For days he forgot his troubles by playing the melodious music of his native land.

Sheriff Wilson believes that Cerboni was driven to suicide by his overactive imagination. He was convinced that he would be hanged by the state for killing a fellow-countryman at a construction camp near Bull Run three weeks ago.

Death Is Predicted. Wednesday night in the presence of Deputy District Attorney Burke Cerboni declared that he would be dead in 24 hours.

Cerboni shot and killed Sam Sacchetti December 3 and was arrested that night by a party of Clackamas and Multnomah county officials near Anderson station on the Estacada line.

NO FRIENDS, NO MUSIC, NO CEREMONY AT BURIAL OF LATE TONI CERBONI

ITALIAN WHO KILLED FELLOW COUNTRYMAN, THEN HANGED SELF LAID TO REST.

Without ceremony, flowers or music and without one friend at the graveside, Toni Cerboni, confessed murderer who took his own life last Thursday in the county jail, was buried at county expense Tuesday morning.

Friends, with whom Sheriff Wilson communicated as soon as Cerboni's body was found, failed to come to Oregon City to take care of the body. Nevertheless, it was held in a morgue here until this morning.

Tuesday morning an undertaker and an assistant carried the plain white box, containing Cerboni's body, to the graveyard at Mountain View, where it was interred.

The mystery of the disappearance of Cerboni's mandolin, with which he often played the melodious music of his native land, has been solved. In ashes in the stove of the jail were found the strings and metal parts of the instrument.
