Officials noted today that the returns received so far indicate that more than OREGON CITY half of the men registered either claimed exemption or gave facts which might exempt them.

The war department may issue a emption, but actual decision on each case will be left to the local authorities. Emphasis is laid on the determination to prescribe no class exemptions, but to pass on cases individually.

Messages from governors all over the country show that there are relatively few shirkers to be dealt with. Aiready the machinery of the government is moving to bring these few to a reckoning.

The chief factor in bringing them to book, however, will not be legal processes. General Crowder and the forces of the department of justice place full reliance in the people themselves in bringing forward these shirkers.

The local exemption boards will almost equal in number the registration precincts. Assurance has been given that a man's own neighbors will be PAIDthe judges to pass upon his case. There were more than 125,000 precincts and equal decentralization will characterize the exemption machinery.
