

MARKET REPORT

PORTLAND, Or., June 22.—First Oregon string beans of the season made their appearance along the street, the initial shipment being reported in from The Dalles by Bell & Company.

PORTLAND, Or., June 25.—Strawberry market lost heavily during the day as regards price with rather liberal offerings and two days' pickings available for the trade.

Another carload of Mississippi tomatoes was reported in during the day in very good shape. Sales were general at \$1.75 a crate of four baskets. California supplies are increasing.

Reports received by the local trade indicate still further damage to the cherry crop of the Willamette valley. The dropping of fruit is also heavier than usual and earlier crop estimates are further reduced.

PORTLAND, Or., June 27.—California black figs reported in at \$2 per box. Some tobacco are again higher. Wax bean supplies from northwest points increasing.

Further lowering of prices for cantaloupes is showing in the local trade with heavier offerings from the south and lower prices there. The extreme top for standards during the day here was \$3.75 per crate.

With a light on for supplies from houses catering to the Puget Sound trade, an advance of 1/4c a dozen is being quoted in some quarters for case count eggs at 30 1/2c. Market along the street is unchanged.

Market for country killed calves has again turned steady along the street with extreme top quality at 15c. This is the only branch of the trade that is showing strength, poor stuff and heavy weights being slow.
