

MARKET REPORT

The receipts of cattle were rather liberal in the yards yesterday including a train load from California and a good shipment of grain fed stuff from Central Oregon.

The general tone of the hog market yesterday and today has been strong with an advance of 10 to 15 cents. Several carloads sold at \$15.75 while the bulk went at \$15.50 to \$15.75, with some light hogs going \$15.45.

The sheep market remains unchanged from conditions prevailing at the close of last week's market. The supply is very light with a falling tendency in most varieties.

There was only a single change in the livestock market at the Portland Union Stock Yards this forenoon, and that was in spring lambs and yearlings, both of which are weaker.
