

MARKET REPORT

PORTLAND, Or., July 6.—The first local raspberries have been received by the Oregon Fruit company and placed on sale at \$2.75 a crate. It is expected the crop this year will be very heavy and receipts should be liberal. Prices will, of course, be much lower before long. Everybody should do all the canning, not only of berries but everything else, possible. There appears to be a little easier tone to the market for ripe tomatoes, east Texas, repacked, are selling for \$1.65 a crate, while Merced bring \$1.35 to \$1.50. A car of Texas tomatoes arrived and was unloaded this morning. Cantaloupes were about steady today, with the top on standards at \$3 to \$2.25 and on Jumbos at \$2.75. From this the prices ranged down to \$1 for flats, of which there were very few. The trade in cants has been very good of late and wholesalers are moving large quantities. There is a much better demand for these than for watermelons, which are selling at 2 1/2 cents a pound.

PORTLAND, Or., July 7.—There were rather heavy receipts of livestock at the Portland Union Stockyards this forenoon, but practically all the stuff was for the Monday market. Prices at that time depend to a large extent upon the quantity and quality of the offerings. Some are looking for a lower cattle market, while others are fearful hogs may decline. Indications are all will remain about at their present level. Trade this forenoon was of a very limited character. Receipts for the day were 290 cattle, 19 calves, 448 hogs, 511 sheep, a total of 19 carloads. For the week 2492 cattle, 114 calves, 2638 hogs, 1369 sheep, a total of 136 carloads.

PORTLAND, Or., July 9.—Front street is expecting a crash in the new potato market. Plenty of new potatoes are on hand. The market is fairly steady at \$3.50 a sack. It is the future that looks favorable for trouble, however. The corner lot garden activity has put Portland effectively out of the market so far as a means of disposing of the farm crop of new potato is concerned. Dealers estimate that there are enough potatoes planted in Portland alone to supply the city for at least three quarters of the coming fall and winter.

New potatoes dug as they are usually by the Oregon farmer will not ship farther than 24 hours' ride, and no market is open in that distance. Consequently several dealers sent out warnings to their customers against consigning to them and advising them not to dig until the crop is fully matured. Store them and wait for orders is the further advice given the dealers. "We won't be able to get 50c a sack for new potatoes if the farmers start shipping in," declared a dealer. "Enough new potatoes will be peddled by the small raiser within the next few weeks to put the price way down, and a heavy influx from out of town will cause an absolute loss to the shipper."
