FOREST FIRES REACH A TOTAL OF NEARLY \$100,000 IN STATE

SALEM, Or., Sept. 10.—In announcing today that the forest fire hazard in Northwestern Oregon was over, and that it was also practically eliminated in the entire state, Deputy Forester Selcke said the damages caused by the fires this season would probably be between \$75,000 and \$100,000.

ALASKAN RAILROAD MAY NOT BE FINISHED BECAUSE OF EXPENSE

WASHINGTON, Sept. 10.—Rapidly rising costs of labor and materials have faced the government with a possible curtailment of the work on the Alaskan railroad or an ultimate increase in the cost of the road, first estimated at \$25,000,000.
