Should you wish to get the capacity of a cask you can do so in the following manner: Take the measurements from the bunghole to the bottom of each end of the cask in inches. Average the two measurements. Multiply this figure by itself twice, then multiply the product by .002266, and the remainder is the number of gallons. Example: 31 inches, 29 inches (average 30 inches); 30×30×30-27,000, which multiplied by .002266=61.182. The contents, therefore, are sixty-one gallons and a fraction.
