Bride of Only A Day Husband Wants Child Wife Calls Him Liar

On the day following their marriage at Heppner, October 16, 1916, Mrs. Leonora Periberg deserted her husband, Albert Periberg, and she became the mother of a daughter July 26 of the following year, according to a complaint filed here by Periberg, who asks for the care and custody of the child. He alleges his wife is living with relatives and strangers at Heppner. Florence S. Wallace has filed a divorce suit against Harry J. Wallace, to whom she was married January 27, 1909. She says he called her a liar, and asks to be allowed to resume her maiden name of Stafford. May McKinnon, who was married to Bert McKinnon at Hood River March 22, 1910, has filed a suit for divorce, alleging cruel and inhuman treatment. She charges him with profanity and says that at Cascade Locks in 1916 she threw dishes and furniture at him. She also alleges that he treated her 13-year-old daughter by a former marriage cruelly.
