NEXT DRAFT ARMY IS CONSIDERED BY DEPARTMENT HEADS

WASHINGTON, Dec. 25 .- Prelimiary arrangements looking to the calling out of the next contingent of the draft army were discussed at a conference at the war department between Secretary of War Baker and Provost Marshal General Crowder.

Reclassification of all drafted men not now with the colors, in accordance with the extent to which their present occupations are essential to the conduct of the war, is expected to be completed before February 1. Regarding reports that plans have been completed to call out 313,000 men on that date, Secretary Baker, following his conference with General Crowder, authorized this statement:

"There is no justification for any report concerning a definite date for the next call nor as to the number to be called out."

It is understood the conference dealt particularly with the problem of establishing camps where drafted men can first be gathered for medical observation before being sent to the training cantonments.

DRUNKEN MOBS RAID WINE CELLARS AND STREETS RUN BOOZE

PETROGRAD, Thursday, Dec. 25. Incessant fighting has occurred in many parts of Petrograd in connection with the efforts to check drunkenness and prevent the raiding of wine cellars. A mob raided one distillery, where 15 soldiers drank themselves to death Fifteen persons were killed and wounded when an armored motor attacked the distillery, which was get on fire. The fire department was prevented from extinguishing the blaze by rowdies, and many persons were burned before the situation was brought under control.


