

# County Court Appoints Deputy Roadmasters and Patrolmen for Year, 1918

The county court Saturday made public the deputy roadmasters and patrolmen, who replace the old road district supervisors. Under the 1917 laws these officials were abolished beginning January 1, 1918, and instead of sixty-five district supervisors the county will this year have nineteen deputy roadmasters and twenty-nine patrolmen, who will work under direction of County Roadmaster Tom Root.

The court has appointed a deputy for each town in the county, with the exception of Oregon City. Many of the appointees are former supervisors of the county who have made good in their various districts.
