

WHEAT CROP IN UNITED STATES PROMISES WELL

WASHINGTON, May 8.—A winter wheat crop of 572,539,000 bushels was forecast today by the department of agriculture, basing its estimate on conditions existing May 1 and on a canvass of the acreage remaining to be harvested.

The area of winter wheat remaining to be harvested on May 1st was 36,393,000 acres, or 13.7 per cent less than the acreage planted last autumn.

Production of hay will be 107,550,000 tons, based on a condition of 89.6 per cent of a normal and an expected acreage of 69,531,000 acres, of which 53,805,000 is tame and 15,726,000 wild.

Stocks of hay on farms May 1 are estimated at 11,095,000 tons. Average condition of pastures was 83.1 per cent of normal; spring plowing was 77.5 per cent completed and spring planting 60.8 per cent.

Private estimates within the last week have placed the prospective crop at from 600,000,000 to 650,000,000 bushels. Last year the crop amounted to 418,070,000 bushels, and the largest crop ever grown was that of 1914, when 684,990,000 bushels were harvested.
