"Briar" Pipe Really White Health. The briar pipe is probably more commonly used because its wide variation in price puts it within the reach of all. It is made from the root of the white henny, a plant indigenous to the south of France, the slopes of the Italian Alps and the islands of Corsica.

As soon as dug the roots are cleaned, saved into rough blocks and packed in jute sacks ready for shipment. Upon reaching the manufacturer they are thoroughly dried, a process requiring about five weeks, and are then turned over to the selectors for grading. The pipes are practically machine made throughout.
