

EDITORS SUPPORT WAR PROGRAM

State Association Denounces Single-Tax Propaganda of C. S. Jackson

The following resolutions were adopted at the recent session of the Oregon State Editorial Association at Coos Bay, Aug. 9, 10, 11, 1918.

Resolved, that the members of this association pledge their continued and undivided support to the government in all its activities designed for the successful prosecution of the war.

Resolved, that we are not in sympathy with the campaign being waged by the magazines to do away with the plan of paying postage under the zone system.

Resolved, that we recognize the wisdom of Congress in recognizing the value of newspaper advertising as a means of floating the government's bonds.

Resolved, that we deprecate the dishonest practice existing throughout the state of members of one political party registering as members of another political party for the purpose of nominating the latter's candidates for office.

Whereas, the National Editorial Association is to hold its 1919 session in the Pacific Northwest, and Whereas, the members of the Oregon State Editorial Association should be afforded the best opportunity to attend the sessions of the National Editorial Association while that Association is meeting in Portland, Oregon, therefore be it.

Resolved, that the selection of the time for holding the 1919 session of the State Editorial Association be referred to the executive committee of this association.

Whereas, the National Editorial Association is to hold its 1919 session in the Pacific Northwest, and Whereas, this organization will visit Oregon, where sessions will be held and where it will be entertained.

Whereas, the National Non-Partisan League has announced its intention to invade the State of Oregon in behalf of its propaganda and organization.

Resolved, that the attention of the members of Congress from this district be called to this very important matter, and such immediate steps taken by them as may be necessary to correct same.

4th. That it seeks to foist upon the people of Oregon radical changes in our system of Government at a time when all our energies should be devoted to the single purpose of winning the war.

Whereas, a bill has been initiated by C. S. Jackson and his attorney, R. W. Hagood, of Portland, which said measure comes before the legal voters of the state of Oregon at the November election, 1918.

Whereas, the Oregon State Editorial Association, during the 1918 session of its convention, has been royally entertained for three days by the open hearted hospitality of the people of Coos Bay.

Whereas, the Oregon Journal has submitted to the voters of the state a measure providing for the repeal of the statute relating to the publication of the delinquent tax list.

Whereas, the 1919 session of the National Editorial Association will be held in the Pacific Northwest.

Whereas, the National Non-Partisan League has announced its intention to invade the State of Oregon in behalf of its propaganda and organization.

Resolved, that the President of the Oregon State Editorial Association be and he hereby is authorized to appoint a committee consisting of members of this association and citizens of Oregon to arrange for the entertainment of the National Editorial Association while that organization is within this state on the occasion of its annual meeting in 1919.

Whereas, the advent of said League into this state is inimical to its welfare for the following reasons:

That the attention of the members of Congress from this district be called to this very important matter, and such immediate steps taken by them as may be necessary to correct same.

Resolved, that we deprecate the dishonest practice existing throughout the state of members of one political party registering as members of another political party for the purpose of nominating the latter's candidates for office.

That the amounts desired for advertising in each county be apportioned and that the method of raising such fund be devised at such time and that such funds, be expended as suggested by the state committee.
