## HOLMAN IS NEXT MAYOR STORY WINS DECISIVELY

Roswell L. Holman has been elected mayor of Oregon City for a 2-year by a decisive majority.

George L. Story was re-elected city attorney over Joseph E. Hedges, and John W. Loder, for recorder, was re-elected without opposition.

In the first ward J. Tobin and R. term, defeating Henry M. Templeton E. Woodward were elected councilmen, the vote being as follows:

Two-year term—Tobin, 178; Metzner, 86; Williams, 79.  
Four-year term—Woodward, 180; Shandy, 133.

I. C. Bridges and E. D. VanAuken have been re-elected to the council for the fourth ward, the vote being as follows:

Two-year term—Bridges, 183; Eberly, 93.  
Four-year term—VanAuken, 158; Scott, 112.

The third ward councilmen were elected by default, Charles W. Kelly being chosen for the 4-year term, and G. W. H. Krueger for the 2-year term, without opposition.

The action of the council in selling a fire house in the South end of the city to the Hawley Pulp & Paper Co. has been approved.

The race between Raymond Caulfield and George E. Swafford for city treasurer is extremely close, and at 3 o'clock this morning, with only Precincts 4 and 7 to hear from, Swafford had a lead of only three votes.

The only other municipal contests in doubt are the councilmen in the second ward. In Precinct No. 5 in that ward Albright and Brady are leading Green and Griffith.

Complete returns from the 11 Oregon City precincts indicate the election of George E. Swafford for city treasurer by a majority of 15 votes, the count being: Caulfield, 594; Swafford, 609.

Holman, for mayor, carried every precinct, except No. 5, the total vote being: Holman, 726; Templeton, 452; Holman's majority, 274.

W. C. Green and Frank Albright were elected to the council from the second ward, Green obtaining 152 votes to 129 for E. A. Brady, a majority of 23 for Green. Albright received 169 votes and George E. Griffith 111, a majority of 58 for Albright.

City Recorder Loder was elected without opposition, and Attorney George L. Story was re-elected, by a vote of 640 to 526 for J. E. Hedges, a majority for Story of 114.

Out of the eight councilmen elected Tuesday, three only are members of the present council, and the municipal body will be made up of the following:

First ward—J. J. Tobin, R. E. Woodward.  
Second ward—W. C. Green, Frank Albright.  
Third ward—C. W. Kelly, W. G. H. Krueger.  
Fourth ward—E. D. VanAuken, I. C. Bridges.

The ordinance authorizing the sale to the Hawley Pulp & Paper Co. of the fire house and ground on Block 28, on the ballot under the referendum, was adopted by a vote of 736 to 265.

According to the unofficial figures from the 11 precincts in Oregon City the ordinance authorizing the issuance of \$10,000 bonds for the purchase of a fire truck, and for a one mill tax levy each year for five years to retire the bonds, and authorizing the council to organize a paid fire department, with a chief at a salary of \$100 a month and one assistant at a salary to be fixed was adopted by the narrow margin of four votes, the

favorable vote being 496, to 492 against the ordinance.

The Home Service work of the Red Cross is to be taken up in Clackamas county she would immediately start to work for two women, who are not otherwise employed or have the time to take up the training work at the Gasco building in Portland, where a six weeks' course is to be given, and these taking the course will return to this city to make an investigation as to where the home war-work service is needed.

## INVESTIGATION OF SINKING SHIPS TO BE UNDERTAKEN SOON

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 6.—An investigation of the mysterious foundering of the coast-built wooden ships Blakford and Coos Bay off the coast of Mexico, was begun today by a committee of five appointed by John H. Rosseter, director of operations of the shipping board.

The inquiry is expected to develop into a general investigation of the entire wooden shipbuilding industry on the Pacific coast, with hearings at Portland, Seattle and other cities where wooden ships are being built. The Blakford and Coos Bay, sailing on a smooth sea, suddenly opened up their seams, took in the sea and sank with such speed that the crew had difficulty in escaping. The opening of the investigation follows the arrival of the crews of two ships here.

Inefficient inspection, the use of green lumber and haste in construction are reported to be the cause of the sinkings.

The shipping board's commission today is examining a number of coast built ships in the San Francisco bay district.

A hearing will probably soon be held in Seattle, where the ship Duca is now being repaired. She steamed out of Puget sound and began to leak so badly she barely reached Seattle afloat, according to word received here.

The commission is composed of Charles W. Saunders, port captain of the Matson Navigation company; Harry Gray of the United Engineering company; Captain John H. Rinder, nautical expert of the Pacific Coast Steamship company; W. Frank Stone, ship designer and builder, and Charles T. Foster, shipbuilder.

## WILLAMETTE MAN DIES OF INFLUENZA AFTER BRIEF ILLNESS

Joseph Robinson, of Willamette, died at the family home at Willamette Wednesday, after a short illness of influenza. He was 40 years of age, and leaves a wife, who is critically ill with the same disease. He also leaves his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Robinson.

The remains are at the Holman & Pace funeral parlors, and arrangements are being made for the funeral services, which will be private.

## VOLCANO ACTION HONOLULU, Nov. 6—A new out break of lava occurred today on the north side of the Mount Kilauea fire pit. A lava lake has formed 10 feet from the rim of the pit.

## RUSSIA WON'T PAY COPENHAGEN, Nov. 5.—Russia has refused to pay the remainder of her indemnity to Germany, according to the Frankfurter Zeitung. Two-thirds of the indemnity has been paid.

## MRS. JAMES FAILING DIED ON WEDNESDAY AFTER LONG ILLNESS

Mrs. James Failing, of Sandy, died Wednesday morning from an illness of paralysis of about four months duration.

Mrs. Failing had resided in Sandy for the last 15 years and her husband, who survives her, has been a resident of that place for over 30 years. They were married in Oregon City about 15 years ago.

Two sisters survive her, one Mrs. Allen, who has been nursing her since her illness, and another sister in New York.

Funeral services will be held Saturday from the Brady & Myers funeral parlors and interment will be in the St. John's cemetery.

## WEALTHY ROYER OF DAMASCUS PASSES AWAY

Wealthy Royer, of Damascus, died at the family home Wednesday after an illness of several months. Her death was due to tuberculosis. She was 27 years of age.

Arrangements for the funeral have not yet been made, but will be in charge of Holman & Pace.

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
