Delicious Fish Balls

Breakfast Cereal with top milk. Stewed or fresh fruit. Fish balls, toast, coffee.

One of the first things that goes to make a good breakfast, is a good fire, said Leigh Hunt, and now especially is this true. Having warm plates and cups, and serving every thing as hot as it can be gotten to the table, is a first class recipe for a comforting breakfast. Hot food in the morning will put any one in good humor and will keep that same body from getting too hungry before lunch. There is no doubt that hot foods satisfy hunger better than cold ones.

Fish balls make an excellent breakfast dish. Of course you are thinking of dried cod fish, but it need not be cod, though this fish is good with potatoes or rice. You may use any cod fish or may buy flinnan haddock or dried salt fish. If it is very salty, freshen it in cold water after it is picked apart, but so early in the season it may be just mildly seasoned (a taste will tell you how long it must be soaked). Remove the bones and mix the flaked fish with twice as much mashed potatoes, add pepper or curry, and shape into cakes. Dredge lightly with flour and fry crisply on one side before turning.

Cold boiled rice may be used in the place of the mashed potatoes, but enough flour must be added to make the rice and fish adhere. Creamed rice or creamed fish of any sort may be used in place of the salt fish, and the cakes are richer for the cream; but more flour must be used to get the consistency right.

Right here let me give directions once more for boiling rice so each grain will be tender but separate, ready to be used in any style: Wash the rice until the water comes away clear, showing all the tale is washed off. Put one cup of rice in one quart of boiling salted water, boil it briskly ten minutes, cover, and simmer it until done. Pour off any remaining water, cover again, and set in the oven five minutes.

When cooking rice, never stir it with a spoon; if it must be stirred use a fork, but you will not need to stir it if you cook it as directed.

We are not frying food now in deep fat, unless we live on a farm and have fat from home-butchered porkers; but when it is again right to use this method of cooking Farm Fish Balls can be made thus: Make the balls the size of walnuts or a little larger and roll in flour. Set them aside until the flour looks moist, then dredge them again. Place in a wire basket and fry in fat until a golden brown.

Other salt fish dishes one can make, if they like new ways, are salt fish chowder; salt fish baked with potatoes diced in milk and cooked in a casserole; salt fish escallop.

This last is best made with rice. Put layers of rice and flaked fish in a buttered dish and let the top layer be rice. Add hot milk to almost cover, grate cheese over the top and season with pepper and butter. Bake until browned.

The Well-Aired House.

"Now," she continued, "I am on my way to purchase a case for camphor, mustard sulphur, licorice powder, liniment, adhesive tape, rolls of bandages, vaseline, water bottle, nasal spray and a lot of drugs."

"Plainly, you must have suffered from the influenza epidemic?" surmised her companion. "No," replied the first speaker, "we warded it off, but it was a terrible worry and an expense and all our clothes smell horribly of asafetida and my head aches from the quinine I took." Just here they left the car so I heard no more of this family's experience, but it seems to be the custom to buy a great quantity of well-known remedies when the season for taking cold comes. Even advertisements in newspapers advise you that "Autumn is the time to stock up with drugs. Why should it be? You need not take cold. That is just what you do; you reach out and help yourself to a cold, as calmly as though it was something you wanted or needed.

The way we treat our bodies—keeping them too hot, and then chilling them suddenly—is one of the strangest things we do. The body is a set of fine instruments that can sometimes be repaired, but never replaced if injured. After half a lifetime spent sitting up late at night, breathing stale air in our sleeping rooms, eating rich food, sitting with wet, cold feet, we spend the remainder running over the globe hunting a climate that suits our patched-up body!

If laws of health were never broken, the body would always be in order; but there will always be some persons who will go from a hot room into cold, who will bundle up their throats and sneeze and be careless, so that a medicine case, well stocked with first aid remedies and the best preventatives, becomes a necessity in the home.

Florence Nightingale, "The Angel of the Crimea," taught that fresh air was the all-important aid to health. "Doors," she taught her assistants, "were made to be shut, windows to be opened." She found that sunshine was good as medicine; and that wounds which obstinately refused to heal yielded to treatment when her patient was kept in the sunshine. Modern physicians say sunshine is worth bushels of chloride of lime, and that clean, pure air is far better than a neck-lace of asafetida.

A good housekeeper keeps her house full of fresh air. If this is done, she will have less need for a medicine chest. However, for the sake of several of my correspondents who have asked me how they can make mustard plasters, I will give the following directions:

How to make a Mustard Plaster: Mix ground mustard with equal quantity of flour, add water to form a paste. Spread on muslin and, if the skin is tender, rub vaseline on before applying the plaster to prevent its blistering. Apply the plaster a little below the pain and not exactly over it.
