were while we were stationed on the Oise river, and while we were out of action during the second battle of the Marne. For a while we were stationed at a place called St. Meames Well, at that place we only had an air raid once or twice a week, so we figured we were out of action, but we have not had all 'peaches and cream' either. We all have had hardships more or less.

The following is a copy of the letter of Colonel R. W. Collins, sent to the First Anti-Aircraft Sector: Headquarters, Anti-Aircraft Service, A. E. F. January 16, 1919 From: Commanding Officer, To: C. O. 1st Anti-Aircraft Sector. Subject: Service in France.

"Dear Mother: "Just received six letters today, two of these being from you, and another from one of the boys, who is on leave in Italy, so you see I am quite lucky. "Well, we left our home at Spoy, four or five days ago, and have been here two days now. We are only about seven miles from Tours, but we are going to move again tomorrow to another place, about 20 miles from here.
