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HAWLEY REPLY TAKES FORM OF SENSATIONAL CROSS CHARGE

Willard P. Hawley, Jr., defendant in the suit brought by his wife, Marjorie Hawley, for divorce filed in Circuit Court here Tuesday. Through his attorneys Mr. Hawley not only answers the complaint filed by his wife but also makes a cross complaint which is full of sensational developments.

In an interview with the Enterprise on Monday night he said that he was unaware of these developments until after his wife brought the action against him.

He admits many of the allegations in the complaint but denies that his interest in Lots 3 to 6 inclusive of Block 54, East Portland is of greater value than \$7,000. He further denies that he owns more than 250 shares of stock in the Hawley Pulp & Paper Company and that the cash market value of this stock is more than \$400 a share. He further states that it was mutually agreed between his wife and himself that she was to receive \$50 per month as "pin" money after he had paid all household bills and expenses. He also denies that his income from all sources is greater than \$20,000 for the year of 1919. He alleges that \$2,500 is a reasonable sum to be allowed for attorney's fees and that \$250 per month is reasonable as temporary alimony for the support of his wife and minor child during the pendency of the suit.

The defendant sets out in his cross complaint actions of an improper character of which his wife was guilty, principally while she was having a vacation at Barview, Oregon, and upon another occasion he alleges that she hid a male caller in a back bedroom when he chanced to come home one evening for about ten minutes and that after he left she entertained this caller in the parlor and that he left before the husband returned later in the evening. He closes his complaint with the allegation that because of these facts, his wife is an improper person to have the care and custody of their child.

The full text of the cross complaint is printed herewith by the Enterprise. It is as follows:

II. Cross Complaint.

Comes now the defendant above named and by way of cross complaint, complains of the plaintiff and alleges:

I. That defendant and plaintiff intermarried at Portland, Multnomah County, Oregon, on or about the 11th day of March, 1916, and ever since have been and still are husband and wife.

II. That the defendant now is, and more than one year immediately preceding the filing of this cross complaint and of suit herein has been a resident of Clackamas County, State of Oregon.

III. That there was born an issue of said marriage one child, Eva Adele Hawley, of the age of about two years.

IV. That the defendant is the owner of Lot 5, Block 52, Oregon City, Clackamas County, Oregon, with a dwelling house located thereon and household goods and furniture situated therein; and is also the owner of an undivided one-third interest in and to Lots 3 to 6, inclusive, Block 54, East Portland, Oregon.

V. That for more than two years last past the plaintiff has treated the defendant in a cruel and inhuman manner, and has inflicted upon this defendant and cross-complainant personal indignities rendering his life burdensome in this, to-wit:

(A) That on July 19th, 1918, this defendant, at the request of the plaintiff and to give her a vacation, did take the plaintiff to Barview, a beach resort near Tillamook, Oregon, and did provide a cottage for the occupancy of the plaintiff, her infant child, her sister and child. That the defendant assisted the plaintiff and her sister in getting settled in said cottage, and on July 21, 1918, returned to his home and the necessary performance of his duties as Manager of the Hawley Pulp and Paper Company at Oregon City, Oregon, where he remained until plaintiff returned on August 9, 1918; that the defendant provided the plaintiff with a maid during her occupancy of said cottage at Barview, and furnished her with ample funds to enable her to enjoy her vacation; that said plaintiff, forgetting the duty which she owed to said defendant and without any cause or provocation on his part, continually and habitually, while she was at Barview, disported herself in such an undignified manner as to cause unfavorable comment in the community of Barview, and brought upon herself a reputation unbecoming to a wife and mother; that every night she would attend dances or other places of amusement in the company of other men, and likewise, in the day time would be found continually and habitually in company with other men, at the swimming hole, upon the jetty, the pier or the beach; that, more particularly, this plaintiff did become infatuated with a certain member of the life-saving crew of the United States Life-saving Service stationed at Barview; that she was repeatedly, habitually and continually in the company of said life guard, at the swimming hole and standing watch with him at the lookout house on the jetty in the daytime, at dances with him in the evening, and at her cottage with him, after the dances, beyond all reasonable hours; that she permitted said life guard to publicly wear her wrist watch which was a birthday present from this defendant; that said lookout house where the plaintiff stood watch with said life guard was on the jetty a half-mile from any other building and was not a proper place for any married woman to be alone with a man other than her husband; that the plaintiff publicly paraded in the day time arm in arm with said life guard; that on the night of August 7, 1918, the plaintiff entertained said life guard alone in her cottage from one to four o'clock A. M. and during said time the said plaintiff and said life guard sat and reclined upon the cot in said cottage, mutually engaging in embracing, kissing, and other demonstrations of affection and endearment; that during her sojourn at Barview, as aforesaid, the plaintiff neglected said child and caused it to be fed improper food and habitually left it entirely to the care of an inexperienced housemaid of fifteen years of age, and on one occasion, left her cottage in the evening to attend said dances and amusements for several hours at a time, without leaving anyone to care for or protect said infant child; that all of the foregoing unbecoming and improper acts of this plaintiff at Barview, were without any cause or provocation on the part of the defendant, and were without the knowledge of this defendant, and he learned of the same only after suit was brought herein by the plaintiff, when, by an anonymous letter and by statements from friends and acquaintances, he was advised of the foregoing facts and learned for the first time that the actions of the plaintiff, as aforesaid, had been the basis of common unfavorable report and gossip and had brought dishonor to himself and family.

(B) That on or about the evening of August 25, 1918, this plaintiff was entertaining a man of about her age in the parlor in the home of the defendant in Oregon City, Oregon; that the identity of said man is unknown to this defendant; that the plaintiff greeted him cordially and was seated with him upon the couch in said parlor, and the curtains at the window were drawn; that this defendant came home in his automobile, driving to the back of the house, and entered the home through the kitchen door; that as this defendant entered the house by way of the kitchen, the plaintiff caused her said male caller to be concealed in a back bedroom where the said male caller remained as long as this defendant was in the house; that this defendant knew nothing of the presence of said male caller in the house, and after being in the house about ten minutes, this defendant left to be gone about two hours; that when this defendant left the house the said male caller again returned to the parlor and continued to be entertained by this plaintiff; that subsequently, before this defendant returned, the said male caller left the house; that this defendant had no knowledge of any of the facts in this paragraph alleged until after the bringing of this suit by the plaintiff.

(C) That during all of the two years last past this plaintiff has been dissatisfied, peevish and irritable, and has continually and unreasonably disagreed with this defendant, and has nagged and harassed this defendant to such an extent as to make life unbearable; that this plaintiff has failed and neglected, during the two years last past, to keep her house in a cleanly manner, or as a housewife should; that during the two years last past she has continually neglected her said infant child and left her without care, or to the incompetent care of others, or to the charity care of her neighbors and friends.

VI. That this defendant has at all times since his marriage to said plaintiff conducted himself as a true and faithful husband, and has provided his said wife with every reasonable convenience and comfort which money could buy, and has in all respects demeaned himself as becomes a husband and father. That each and all of the acts on the part of the plaintiff hereinbefore complained of were done by her without any cause or provocation on the part of the defendant.

Wherefore, the defendant prays for the decree of this Court:

1. Dissolving the bonds of matrimony heretofore existing between the parties hereto;

2. Awarding the care, custody and control of said infant child to this defendant;

3. Divesting the plaintiff of any interest of dower or otherwise in and to the real property of the defendant described in paragraph "IV" of this Cross Complaint.

4. And for such other and further relief as may meet with equity and to the Court seem just.

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Maine Leads, Oregon Fifth

The United States Department of Agriculture announce as a result of their survey of the potato crop of 1919, that Maine again leads in the highest average yield per acre, her average being 225 bushels and a total acreage of 102,000. Nevada ranks second, with an average yield of 150 bushels per acre. Idaho is third with an average of 145 bushels. Oregon has been a steady producer with an average for ten years of 126 bushels. This year owing to the drouth she dropped to 95 bushels. New York leads every state in acreage with a total of 357,000 acres and an average of 105 bushels. Michigan and Minnesota rank next in acreage, but their yields this year were below the average being respectively 88 and 87 bushels.

This places Oregon for the year as fifth in average yield per acre, and with an average of 45,000 as 12 in area planted.

If Oregon were to give the same attention to her potato crop, in selection of seed and cultivation, there is little doubt, but a few years would see her equal if not excel Maine in yield per acre.
