MARJORIE ATTORNEYS
ARE GIVEN \$3500 FEE

Three thousand five hundred dollars will be paid to C. Schuebel, C. D. Latourette and Earle C. Latourette, attorneys for Mrs. Marjorie Hawley in the Hawley divorce suit that was wound up last Friday and is now in the hands of Circuit Judge Bagley for decision. In an order filed here for decision, the defendant, is directed to pay within 10 days \$3000 as a final and total payment, exclusive of \$500 allowed soon after the complaint was filed.

The attorney fees of \$3500 is a trifle more than one-third of the maximum amount fixed by the court in his original order. When Mr. Schuebel filed the original complaint he asked for an attorney fee of \$15,000, and Judge Campbell fixed a maximum fee of \$7500. Later Judge Campbell was barred from the case on the defendant's affidavit of prejudice, and Judge Bagley was named and he fixed \$10,000 as a maximum amount. The court ordered \$500 paid to Mr. Schuebel soon after the suit was instituted, and after the Latourettes became associated in the case an additional amount was asked for, but the court refused to allow it.

The fee of \$3500 covers additional service in the event an appeal is taken by either party after the decision is handed down.

NEW COMPANY
MAKE PLANS TO
ENLARGE MILL

The Willamette River Lumber company, recently organized in this city, is planning to enlarge their mill, formerly known as the Oregon City Lumber company, and carry on the business on an extensive scale. At present they have a crew of men at work making the mill ready for improvements.

One of the principal stockholders of the new company is R. H. Nelson, a well known lumberman of Centralia, who has been operating the Forest Lumber company near that place. C. W. Guerries, an experienced sawmill man will be manager of the plant, and J. K. Simpson, prominent lumberman of Portland, and A. O. Jackson, who has been operating the mill, will also be connected with the company.

A large amount of new machinery will be installed and after the company make arrangements they intend to operate two shifts of men. At present the new owners are negotiating for a large tract of timber known as the Buckner tract, which was recently purchased by the Montavilla Fuel company.

This mill was constructed here several years ago and was known as the Oregon City Lumber company. This was taken over by the First National bank on a \$10,000 mortgage and the mill was idle for several years. Later the planing mill machinery was sold to Japanese interests and shipped to Japan. Several months ago the Jackson Lumber company was started on the site and now Mr. Jackson is interested with the new owners.

The new company is incorporated for \$50,000 and as soon as full operations are started a large number of men will be employed.
