S. P. Freight Train Ditched Near U. of O.

EUGENE, May 12.—By the breaking of an axle, or the spreading of the rails on the Southern Pacific line, several cars in the middle of a northbound freight were thrown from the track near the University of Oregon Tuesday. A steel gondola, loaded with ballast, was overturned into the ditch and crushed into a shapeless mass by the weight of the cars behind it, and one of the ordinary box cars was reduced to splinters, while two other cars were jolted from the rails by the impact.

Considerable damage was done to the tracks, tying up traffic for several hours. The tracks of the Springfield streetcar line, which parallels the Southern Pacific, was blocked by the debris. No one injured.

The boxing fans had an opportunity of witnessing one of the best cards ever staged at the Milwaukie boxing arena Wednesday night. All of the five contests going the limit. Both boys put up a fine exhibition of gameness and never slowed up until the bell sounded, at the finish of the sixth round the decision going to Rocco. The next was an exhibition of fast and furious fighting between Muff Bronson of Portland and Joe Mandot of K. C., Mo. This was an eight round go and was considered by many old fight fans as one of the keenest and cleverest fought battle seen in the Milwaukie arena. The decision was a well earned draw.

The semi-windup was between Sammy Gordon and Billy Mascot both of Portland, they fought an eight-round go to the tune of a decision for Mascot, but many fans thought it should have been a draw.

The main event of the evening was a ten round go between Frankie Murphy of Denver and Johnnie McCarty of San Francisco. These boys weighed in at 145 pounds, and what, at first looked like a sure K. O. before the end of the tenth round and was a little like fanning out at times. Murphy went right along until the seventh round slugging and trying to put McCarty away but finally slowed up. Murphy seemed to be the pride of the fans but McCarty showed such fine skill and form that he finally mastered his opponent and all but stopped Murphy at the end of the tenth round and was given the decision.

INBOUND ELECTRIC TRAIN CREW BLAMED FOR FATAL CRASH

PORTLAND, May 12.—Following a long session featured by sharp verbal clashes between opposing legal elements, the coroner's jury early this morning found that the Southern Pacific collision at Bertha last Sunday, causing deaths of nine passengers and injury to scores, was the result of failure of the crew of inbound train No. 124 to obey company orders to wait for the outbound train.

The jury, however, admitted the possibility that Engineer Silas W. Willett, who was killed, was physically or mentally incapacitated immediately prior to a crash.

Representatives of the Southern Pacific company at no time attempted to deny that the crew of the inbound train was wholly at fault.
