Capt. J. C. Sawyer, aged 82 years, of Oregon City, Captain of Company H, 16th Vermont Infantry.

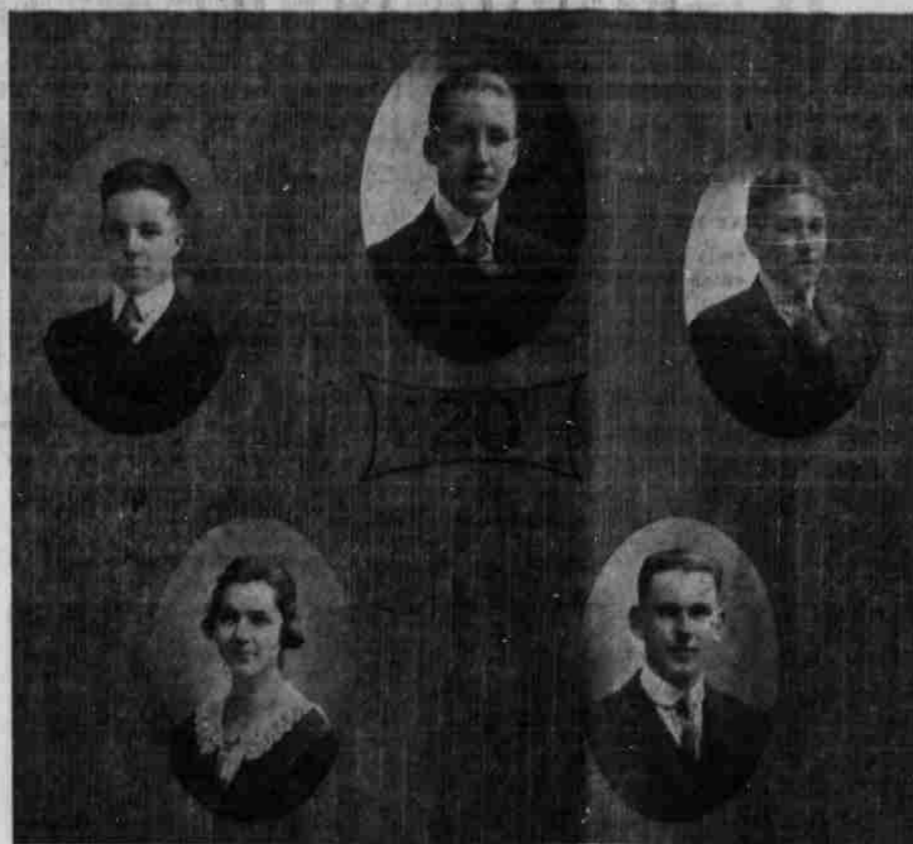
Captain John W. Kelly, 84 years, of Oregon City, member of Drum Corps, member of regular army before the Civil War and not in the latter war.
