GOVERNMENT WARNED TO REFRAIN FROM BOMBARDING PEKIN

PEKIN, July 12.-Warning has been given the government by the diplomatic corps here that in case of an uprising there must be no fighting in this city and that Pekin must not be subject to bombardment. Forces commanded by Tuan Chi Jui, former premier and minister of war, are surrounding Pekin.

General Wu Pel Fu who has been relieved of the command of government troops in Chih Li, is near Pao Ting Fu thirty miles south of here, but whether fighting occurs there will depend, it is said, upon the acceptance by Wu Pei Fu of his dismissal.

General Tuan Jul's threatening attitude is a result of the government's dissmissal of General Hau Shu Cheng as resident evonmissioner for inner Mongolia. He is a leader of the Anfu element which received a defeat when the appointment of Chow Shumu to the premiership was announced.

Eugene Store Is Destroyed By Fire

EUGENE, Or., July 14.-Fire that started at 1:30 o'clock this afternoon completely rained th clarge drygoods store of F. E. Dunn, pioheer merchant of this city. The two-story brick building which the store occupied was also badly damaged and probably will have to be rebuilt.

The fire started in the furnaca room in the rear of the main salesroom. Some trash in the furnace was set afire to get rid of it and soon afterwards the rear portion of the building was ablaze. Firemen with seven streams of water playing on the building, worked an hour before they succeeded in extinguishing it. The blaze reached the upper story. which is divided into apartments and office rooms, and getting a footbold between the ceiling and roof, burned fiercely.
