Out In The Open

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"Get a book of checks from your local bank. Use the form checks provided by the League as little as possible.

"Accept cash or cash checks in payment of memberships. Secure all the cash you can, but if it is impossible to secure checks, accept post-dated checks due not later than October 1, 1920.

"Encourage every man to give you a cash check. Your enemies fight with cash, not post-dated checks. Make all checks payable to the captain of your crew.

"On a separate slip of paper, write the names and addresses of all men who refuse to join the League, giving one reason for their refusal. This is very important and should not be neglected.

"After the completion of your work, send all checks, properly indorsed, together with your new report and list of all men who refused to join, to your county manager, who will issue and mail membership receipts to all members."
