Wallace Dalen, of this city, is afflicted, but of a light nature. Two brothers of the young man were also ill, but a physician not having been summoned, and the boys confined to their beds for any length of time.

As a preventative of the disease spreading further, Dr. Dedman, who is on the school board, deemed it advisable to have the pupils of the school, where Dalen attended, vaccinated.

DOWNTOWN SITE FOR CITY HALL IS CHOSEN

The site for the new city hall was definitely settled Wednesday night when the council voted five to three to purchase the Schram property on Water street precluding the measure placing it in McLoughlin Park.

Those voting against the Schram property were Green, Eby and Albright, who have advocated the McLoughlin Park from the first.

The council has been divided over this question ever since the bonds were voted for a new city hall and fire truck and have failed to come to any definite conclusion.

A number of sites have been considered and several mass meetings of citizens have been called to discuss the matter.

Residents of the hill section circulated a petition to have the matter put on the ballot asking that the McLoughlin Park be chosen.
