ILL NEAR ESTADA BURNED TO GROUND LIQUOR SCANDAL INVOLVES EX-DRY

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 1 .- Federal grand jury indictments against persons in an alleged liquor selling conspiracy, removed today from the secret file, revealed charges that Mrs. Glad K. Warburton, formerly acting federal prohibition director, had conspired to violate the probibition law. and that John D. Costello, secretary to United States Senator Phelan, had told Harry Marquard, restaurant owner, to set aside from the profits of his liquor sales 10 per cent for the "democratic election fund."

During Mrs. Warburton's tenure of nine days, according to the indictments, 124 barrels of whiskey was illegally withdrawn from bonded warehouses. She was accused of approving feloniously a permit for the withdrawal of 20 of the barrels. Costello was charged with having promised thorities having told them to go ahead and sell liquor, and having advised him to stop selling temporarily because a raid was imminent.
