the service February 20, 1919. After his discharge he returned to Oregon City, where he has since resided at the Niles country home.

Royal Niles was born in Portland December 20, 1888, and at the age of one year his parents moved to Walla Walla, Wash., where he received his education. He attended and graduated from Whitman college. While a student of the institution he made a record as a football player, taking part in a number of the big games of the Northwest. It was through his excellent work that Whitman college won some of the best games ever played in the Northwest. He was one of the greatest football players Whitman college ever had, and was also one of the most popular young men attending the college. He played fullback for four years, and was captain of the football team one year. After completing his studies at the Whitman college, Mr. Niles engaged in teaching, and was among the leading instructors of the state. Among the places where he taught were at Marshfield, Klamath Falls and La Grande. It was while engaged in teaching that he was called to the colors.

Mr. Niles was a member of the Congregational church, and formed a club, which was composed of about 45 boys, and each Sunday the members of the club would congregate and receive instruction by Niles.

Mr. Niles is survived by two brothers, Ralph W. Niles, employs of the Oregon City postoffice, and Eugene B. Niles, of Coburg, Oregon. His mother, Mrs. Vinson Niles, died in Oregon City November 6, 1920. Mr. Niles is the nephew of Mra. E. J. Swafford, of Salem.
