OBITUARIES

Frank Skillman, aged 77 years, died at his home at Mount Pleasant, about two miles from Oregon City Thursday morning at 2 o'clock.

Mr. Skillman, who was a retired druggist, arrived in Oregon City from New York about sixteen years ago, where he purchased a small farm near Mount Pleasant.

Deceased is survived by his wife, Mrs. Mary Skillman, of Mount Pleasant, and several brothers and sisters of Portland. The remains are at the undertaking parlors of Holman & Pace, but funeral arrangements have not yet been made.

The funeral services of Franklin Skillman, who died at his home at Mount Pleasant Thursday, will be held from the Congregational church in this city Monday afternoon at 2 o'clock. The pastor of the Dayton, Washington, Congregational church, old time friend of the deceased, is to officiate, with interment in Mountain View cemetery.

Word has been received in this city by relatives and friends of Andrew Robertson, former resident on Oregon City, whose home has for a number of years been in Sellwood, died in Arizona Thursday, March 24, after a brief illness of lung trouble.

Mr. Robertson recently left for Arizona for the benefit of his health, his family being with him at the time of his death.

Deceased engaged in the grocery business in Oregon City for some time previous to taking up his home, entering a similar business in Sellwood. He was an active member of the Presbyterian church while residing here, and well known in this city.

Mr. Robertson is survived by his wife, Mrs. Emily Robertson, formerly Miss Holden, of this city, whom he married while residing here; a daughter, Miss Lillian Robertson and a son, Edward Robertson, of Sellwood. He also leaves a sister.

Deceased was a son-in-law of Mrs. A. Holden, of Oregon City, and brother-in-law of Mrs. F. W. Greenman, of Eighth and Madison streets.

The remains are being shipped north, and funeral services are to be held in Sellwood upon the arrival of the body.

The funeral services of Francis Foster, who died suddenly at his home near Willamette Saturday evening, were held from the Holman & Pace funeral chapel Monday afternoon at 2 o'clock.

Rev. Willis Pettibone, pastor of the Baptist church, officiated, and a large number of friends of the family attended the services.

Interment was in the Mountain View cemetery.

The funeral services of the late Frank Skillman were held from the Congregational church Monday afternoon at 2 o'clock. Many friends of the family attended the services.

Mrs. John Crawford sang most impressively, "Lead Kindly Light" and "Crossing the Bar," with Mrs. Melvina McCord of Sellwood, accompanist.

The officiating clergyman from Dayton, an old time friend of the deceased, spoke highly of the character of Mr. Skillman, whom he had known for many years.

Mr. Skillman was an influential man of New York, where he engaged in the druggist business, later moving to South Dakota, before coming to Oregon 16 years ago.

Mr. Skillman was a veteran of the Civil War, and his casket was draped with the national colors. A number of the old veterans here attended the funeral services. Deceased was a member of the Masonic lodge. Interment was in the Masonic cemetery.

Many beautiful floral tributes, covered the grave.

Elmer E. Comstock, aged 26 years, died at the family residence at Canby Saturday night from tuberculosis.

Deceased is survived by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Comstock, and a brother, of Canby, and a sister, residing in Washington.

SALEM, Dr. March 24.—A fire loss estimated at between \$75,000 and \$100,000 was suffered by Katoory Bros., a mercantile firm on State street, early Wednesday, when practically their entire stock was destroyed.
