BONDS BILL UNDERTAKING LOOMING BIG

PLAN BIGGEST OF KIND SAYS GOVERNOR

Commission Hard At Work To Get Oregon Law Into Operation

The bonus bill, with the expenditure which it will involve on the part of the state, is the biggest thing of its kind ever undertaken by Oregon. This was the statement made by Governor Ben Olcott, ex-officio member of the bonus commission, to Phil Hammond, who talked with the governor and members of the commission during his recent visit to the state capital.

Mr. Hammond, who was one of the originators of the bonus measure and who has been answering questions upon the law through the columns of the Enterprise found that the commission is struggling with a mass of work in its effort to get the law into operation. According to the provisions of the act, no bonuses can be paid or loans issued until the special rules are outlined by the commission.

Many Loans Expected. Members of the commission believe, according to Mr. Hammond, that fully 80 percent of the men eligible to take advantage of either the loan or bonus, will apply for the bonus. This will entail the sale of the greater part of the \$30,000,000 in bonds provided for under the bonus law.

While not all of these applications will be made in a bunch, it is the belief of the commission that they will come in soon after the law is put into actual operation. The commission has found that it is facing such a mass of detail, that it will probably not be able to receive applications as early as was expected.

It was first believed that the applications would be called for this October, but Mr. Hammond found that the commission members do not expect to be able to get into actual operation by this date, although they are attempting to get the wheels moving as soon as possible.

Flaws Are Found. The statement, that there are "holes" in the bonus bill, Mr. Hammond found was partially substantiated in the experience of the commission. These are mostly in the way of errors in the construction of the bill, and also they add to the difficulty of outlining detailed policy, will not, it is believed, form a permanent or serious obstruction in the way of the administration of the act.

The bill will make the state of Oregon practically the largest trust company in the west. Interest paid on the loans will run several millions a year, and there are few firms which handle this volume of business. Although the state will not enter into an actual trust business, the type of finances handled under the bonus bill will be practically of this nature.
