# BONUS BILL

The bonus bill, with the expenditure which it will involve on the part of the state, is the Liggest thing of its kind ever undertaken by Oregon. This was the statement made by Covernor Ben Olcott, ex-officio member of the bonus commission, to Phil Hammond, C. B. Woodworth, Plaintiff who talked with the governor and members of the commission during his recent visit to the state capita).

Mr. Hammond, who was one of the originators of the bonus measure and who has been answering questions upon the law through the columns of the Enterprise found that the commision is struggling with a mass of work in ite effort to get the law in operation. According to the provisions of the act no bonuses can be paid or loans issued until the special rules are cutlined Ly the commission.

Flaws Are Found

The statement that there are "holes in the bonus bill, Mr. Hammond found was partially sustantiated in the experience of the commission. These are mostly in the way of errors in the construction of the bill, and altho they add to the difficulty of outlining detailed policy, will not, it is believed, form a permanent or serious obstruction in the way of the administration of the act.

The bill will make the state of Or gon practically the largest trust company in the west. Interest paid on the loans will run several millions a year, and their are few firms which handle this volume of business. Altho the state will not enter into an actual trust business, the type of finances \$325,779.40 handled under the bonus bill will be practically of this nature.

The number of men who will have to be employed in the state to carry out the provisions of the bill will total, according to present estimates of the commission, 298. This will include at torneys to handle the titles and legal work, and appraisers to evaluate the land offered as security. '
