Peculiar circumstances have developed which lead to the belief that the murder was the result of a fight, in which Hecker killed in self defense. The fact that the confessed slayer had liquer cache in Clackamas county, leads to the hellet that there was some dispute over the booze here which resulted in Bowker's death.

There is a possibility, it is said, that the hop sack in which the dead man's body was sunk into the river near Albany, may have been stolen from one of the hop yards near Oregon City. Representatives of young Hecker declined to verify it, but the new theory, held by old heads in place of that of cold-blooded robbery, is that the murder occurred in Clackamas county.
