Degraded Story Of Marital Life Bared In Court
After being forced, for six years, to countenance the illegitimate relationship between her husband and her daughter, and caring for the two children born to the mistress of the man she married, Olive J. Craddock, Sellwood, Portland, was Saturday granted divorce from Don Carlos Craddock, an employe of the Portland Telephone company.
Craddock, she testified in the Clackamas county circuit court, had admitted to her intimacies with Jane Guastad, her daughter by a former marriage. The daughter, she said, had admitted to her the identity of the father of the two children, aged 6 and 2.
"How long has this condition existed?" she was asked by the referee.
"For six years," was the reply.
In granting the decree, Judge J. U. Campbell awarded the plaintiff \$75 a month as permanent alimony, together with a house and lots 1 and 2, block 15, Sellwood, and personal property on the premises.
The couple were married in Nome, North Dakota, in 1910. The suit was contested by the defendant.
A decree of divorce was also granted to John C. from Melissa L. Vaughan. Mrs. Vaughan, the husband told the court, had been married three times before, while he had never been wedded before.
They were wedded in Portland October 22, 1920. Cruel treatment was alleged.

Oda E. against P. W. Jones, married in Salem, April 15, 1915.
James L. against Alice Z. Mans, married in Hood River, April 15, 1913.

RESIDENCE LOST IN BLAZE DUE TO OIL EXPLOSION
The inside of the building completely gutted, the furnishings in the residence occupied by J. W. Courtney, 15th and Jackson streets, are a total loss and the structure, owned by Mrs. A. Simmons, is partially destroyed.
The fire broke out at 4:30 o'clock Thursday afternoon, and is believed to have been caused by the explosion of an oil stove which the 16-year-old daughter of Mrs. Courtney was lighting. An alarm was turned in by Mrs. A. J. Wilson, residing near by, and good work was done by the fire company in saving the building from total destruction and protecting adjacent buildings. The house was of two story structure.
Mrs. Simmons Rented House.
Mrs. Simmons, who is now making her home with her daughter, Mrs. E. J. Lanfkins, of Viola, had rented the residence furnished. The Courtney family have been residing at William street until a month ago when taking possession of the Simmons house. There was no insurance carried by the Courtney family, who also lost all clothing.
The damage has not been accurately estimated but is believed to be more than \$1,000.
Meldrum Barn Burns.
A fire destroyed a barn and garage at the home of G. E. Heathman, of Meldrum, Thursday morning, at 2:30 o'clock. The cause is unknown but it is believed to have been the work of traps, for there was considerable hay in the barn, and an opening in the building where any one could enter.
A cow in the barn and also an automobile were saved, but twelve chickens were killed. The automobile was saved from the building.
By the work of neighbors, who formed a bucket brigade, other buildings on this place and several owned by neighbors close by were saved. The poultry house and barn of William Gardner caught fire several times but each time the flames were extinguished.
The buildings destroyed were partly covered by insurance. The damage is several hundred dollars.
This is the second fire at Meldrum in a month's time. A barn owned by Victor Erickson of that place was recently destroyed. This was believed of incendiary origin.

OREGON CITY MAN WINS ESSAY CONTEST PRIZE

JAPANESE WITHDRAW GOLD
WASHINGTON, D. C.—The Chinese Merchants of South Manchuria, particularly in Kwantung leased territory, opposed effectively during the past year the Japanese endeavor to negotiate transactions in gold yen notes exclusively.

HIGH WATER EFFECT ON BRIDGE TO BE STUDIED
Contractors and engineers in construction of the new Pacific highway bridge which will join Oregon City and West Linn, replacing the old suspension structure, are making every preparation to observe effects of the coming "spring flood" of the river here.
Allegations have been made that the bridge will hinder the flow of water at flood stage and that the western pier, in particular, will cause a log jam to form. While engineers deny that this will happen, the expected high stage of the river is expected to answer the question for all time.
Construction work on the big span is now advanced to far above high water line, so the rise in the river will not cause any cessation of activity. Floating derricks, leading platforms and other similar equipment, however, is being prepared for rapid moving should the river suddenly start to rise, and will be moored downstream if the current becomes too strong.

PROFANITY AND DRUNK CHARGES BRING FINES
Pleading guilty to charges of being drunk and disorderly, and using profane language, W. C. McNeil was Monday fined \$30 in the recorder's court. A fine of \$25 was assessed on the first case and \$5 for the latter.
A charge of driving a car while intoxicated, is still pending in the justice court. Judge Noble has not yet set the date for the hearing.

YARN STOCKS HELD
WASHINGTON, D. C.—In order to supply the very quick delivery requirements of cloth manufacturers, yarn mills in England are today holding exceptionally large stocks, according to Trade Commissioner Butler, London.
