Mrs. Sadie Bosholm is Facing Action in U. S. Court on Indictment for Sending of Obscene Matter Thru Mails

HEARING SCHEDULED FOR NOVEMBER 21ST

Anonymous Letter Received By Mrs. Maroney Prompts Probe; Details are Veiled.

A tale of neighborhood jealousy and perhaps an unusual study in psychology, will be revealed when the federal case against Mrs. Sadie Bosholm, of Sandy, comes to trial in the United States Courts.

According to the indictment, the letter, an anonymous epistle, was written to Mrs. Alma Maroney, of Sandy. The wording of the letter, the true bill charges, is "obscene, lewd and lascivious."

The letter was placed in the hands of a handwriting expert; Neighborhood gossip for some time had told of a disagreement between the two women, over apparently no cause at all.

The authorities intimate that in the trial of the case other anonymous letters of a somewhat similar nature, received by Mrs. Bosholm herself, will be introduced.

The letter on which the specific indictment is based was mailed September 15 at Sandy.

BRITISH CITIZENS ARE BEATEN BY MOSLEMS

Food and Medical Aid Is Sent On Steamer Peru; Few Reports of Death Made.

SANTIAGO, Nov. 14.—Reports of banditry and disorder in the earthquake district together with news of additional earth shocks and indications that the calamity has reached appalling proportions caused the Chilean government today to consider the advisability of sending troops to Coquimbo and Atacama to reinforce the regular garrisons, which are too small to cope with the situation and aid in relief work.

The inland town of Freirina is virtually ruined and scores are dead there according to a wireless message from Freirina, numbering 3600 persons, had been cut off from outside communication until today.

The steamer Peru has sailed with food and medical supplies to succor the inhabitants of the stricken cities all along the upper coast.

Two Hundred Die In Fire on Vessel Off Yangtze River

SHANGHAI, Nov. 10.—Two hundred persons are reported to have perished in a fire on the river boat Tashing off the mouth of the Yangtze river.

It virtually was impossible that any foreigners were aboard the vessel. Those who lost their lives were hawkers and coolies, according to unconfirmed reports.

The heavy laden steamer was traveling from Whangpoo toward Shanghai when the fire broke out. A panic seized the crowded ranks of persons. Passengers and crew fled in a single small boat. The blazing steamer, unmanned, drifted down stream, many leaping overboard.

The menace to other shipping removed itself when the craft grounded below Pootung, opposite the industrial section of Shanghai at Yangtze-poo.

Bodies are being piled on the beach of the river. The flames on the hull were extinguished by police and firemen.

The vessel was one of a large fleet owned by a Chinese company trading between Shanghai and the islands at the mouth of the Yangtze.
