Man Acquitted Of Murder "Spirited Away" to Safety

YAKIMA, Wash., Nov. 28—Claude A. Labbee, acquitted of the murder of L. A. Wright, another reservation rancher, by verdict of a jury late Sunday afternoon, has been spirited away from the Yakima county jail by Sheriff Paq R. Bear because of the high feeling evidenced since the news became public.

Labbee was taken first to Ellensburg, but it is understood that he will be in Walla Walla by morning and held there for safe keeping till his second trial.

At the time of the shooting of Wright on June 20, 1922, Mrs. Wright also was wounded and is in the hospital here with a bullet in her brain.

Labbee is being held on a first degree assault charge for that offense, which will be changed to a murder charge if she should die.

Lynchings was talked at the time of the shooting and Labbee, who was also wounded in the shooting affray, was taken from the hospital to the jail to prevent it. Numerous calls and veiled threats Sunday night caused the sheriff to take the above precautions.
